Rob came in to each class in order to tell us about dog welfare. He started in year R and worked his way up to year 6. In each class, he gave an experienced talk about looking after your dog(s). Those of us who didn't own a dog picked up some key tips if they ever got one in the future.

He spoke to about washing our hands properly around dogs. He used UV lights to demonstrate how clean/unclean our hands were after thoroughly washing them. He put some liquids on our hands that reacted to the UV light showing our germmy hands. We were then told to wash our hands if he could see the reaction we would have to wash our again.
