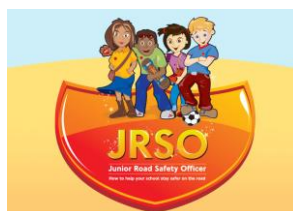

Dear Parents,

The message from parents is clear to us. You want behaviour to be good. We want that too. Yesterday we had our own Armistice service. The children planted their poppies into the mound and we spoke about the effects of war and the need for peace and respect. On that day, I had parents verbally fighting and displaying aggression in front of the children on school grounds, the language used was unacceptable. I have also had parents question the school about why their child was spoken to regarding their behaviour choices. Sometimes, in all honesty, we feel we are in a catch 22 situation. We want everybody's behaviour at Nursling to reflect our school values of love, hope and courage.

So I would like to be really clear...

- Under no circumstances is it acceptable for any parent to approach someone else's child to reprimand them. There are always two sides to a story and there are ways and means of sorting things out. Approach the parent, not the child. Come into school.
- Do not use offensive language on school grounds and in front of children.
- Model good behaviours for the children to learn from. They are very perceptive – sometimes more than we give them credit for. If you gossip and bad mouth, the children will do the same.

We all want the best for our children. If you have a concern or issue, please come to the office to make an appointment with the appropriate person. The table from September 7th newsletter has been added below as a reminder.
