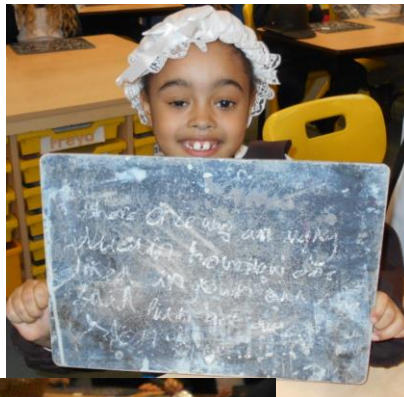


Year Two Victorian Day

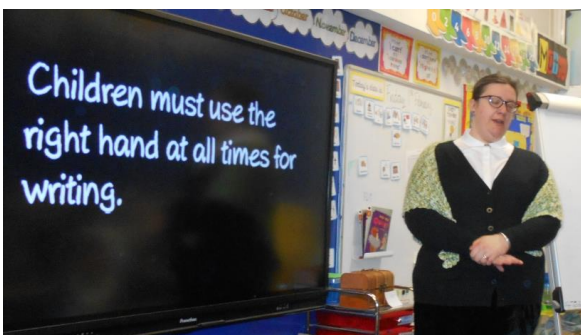
